COLOR	All text was readable on the background. The background colors were appropriate for the content included in the presentation and adhered to the research for use of background colors.	Some colors utilized for backgrounds/ fonts made text unreadable. Used background colors that may have elicited emotions that were not appropriate for the presentation.	Consistently utilized colors for backgrounds/ fonts which made the text unreadable. Also used background colors that elicited emotions that were counter to the content of the presentation.
FONT	A limited number of fonts were included. All fonts were readable and adhered to the research for style of font to be used. Font size used allowed easy reading of the information.	Some different fonts were included on slides. Some fonts were hard to read because of style and/or size.	Different fonts were included in the presentation and even on the same slide. Many fonts that were hard to read were included. Some fonts were too small.
ANIMATION AND SOUNDS	Animations that were appropriate to the presentation of the content were included. A consistent transition was used between all slides. Sounds that were included supported the content of the presentation.	Animations were used on various slides, but did not enhance the slide show. More than one type of transition was used between slides. Sounds were used that may not have supported the content of the slide show.	Multiple animations used on a single slide. Differing transitions were utilized between every slide. Many different sounds were used for both animations and transitions and they did not support the content.
IMAGES	Images were used to illustrate a concept that was being described within a text, strengthen a point of persuasion, to represent data that was being described within the text, or to express a feeling or attitude.	Some images used supported the content being presented, but most were simply decorative and may have been distracting to the learner.	Images used were distracting, unrecognizable, too small or large, and did not support the presentation of the content at all.
